Curriculum vitae Sebastian Berger

Sebastian Berger is a former international student leader and currently serves as chief of staff to Josefstadt's district mayor Martin Fabisch in Vienna.

Previously, he was the Executive Director of the Global Student Forum, the worldwide umbrella organization of student unions in 136 countries, Vice President of the <u>European Students' Union</u> in Brussels, and held various positions within the Austrian National Union of Students (ÖH) at both the federal level and the University of Vienna.

From 2021 to 2024, he served as Chair and Spokesperson of the Education and Academia Stakeholder Group at the United Nations, acted as an education policy advisor to UN Secretary-General António Guterres, and was a board member of the 100 Million Campaign, founded by Nobel Peace Prize laureate Kailash Satyarthi. In addition, he worked as global research coordinator alongside Dr. Manja Klemencic on the Harvard University SIHEG Project, which culminated in the publication publication "Student Politics and Representation in Higher Education" (Bloomsbury US). Berger holds a Bachelor's degree in Political Science from the University of Vienna and a Master's degree in International Relations from NUP Cyprus.
